
General news:



Our learning this half term:



This half term, we have started our English work by learning about persuasive writing in preparation for our Student Council speeches. The children have already made a good start at thinking about parenthesis and will learn lots more grammatical features over the course of the year. Later, we will move onto narrative work, exploring descriptive features to bring characters to life.

This half term is all about place value and addition and subtraction. We have started by learning the skills behind Roman Numerals, before then considering the place value of different numbers up to 1 million. You could practise at home by thinking about the value of digits in large numbers, and also what 1, 10, 100, 1000 etc more or less would be. Also, please make sure all times tables are learnt to 12x12 if not already!





This half term, we are enlightening ourselves about light. We shall learn about how light travels in straight lines, reflection, shadows, the colour spectrum and more! Feel free to explore this at home by looking at how mirrors work or even refracted light through glasses of water.

Our theme this half term is the Tudors. We will be learning about Henry VIII, Anne Boleyn, Royal Progress and Tudor inventories. We will also link our theme with artwork, thinking about Tudor fashion, and also with our Outdoor Education, exploring Tudor architecture.





Jigsaw is the name of the scheme of work we follow as a school when teaching PSHE (Personal, Social and Health Education). This half term, we are learning about 'Being Me in My World'. We have already had some fascinating and enlightening discussions around rights and responsibilities, migrants and refugees, and the UNCRC (United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child), and we will continue our learning by focussing on rewards and consequences in school as well as creating our learning charter.
